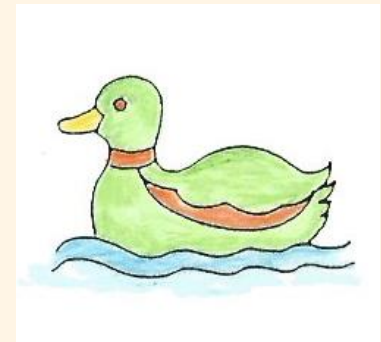

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## b/d Game

This game will help your child to tell the difference between b and d, two letters which are often confused by young children. A general rule is to remember that 'b' is a stick hitting the ball the way we read.

### To make:

Print out all pages, pages 4 to 7 on card if possible. Cut up the picture cards.

OR you can play this game round the other way too, and use the pictures as baseboards so your child has to select the correct letter.

### To play:

Each player chooses a base board. The picture cards are spread out, face down over the table. Players take it in turns to choose a card. They say the word, listen for the initial sound and then decide if it goes on their card or not. If it does, it is placed over one of their letters. If not, it is returned to the pool of pictures on the table. Play continues until one player has completed their card. They are the winner.

Do: Encourage your child to finger trace (correctly) the letter they choose before beginning the game. Emphasise the initial sound of each word as it is chosen and asks who has that letter on their board? Encourage your child to help you, so they get extra practice.
