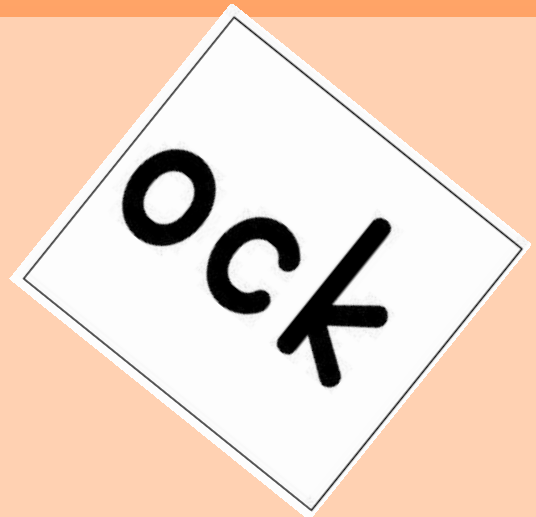
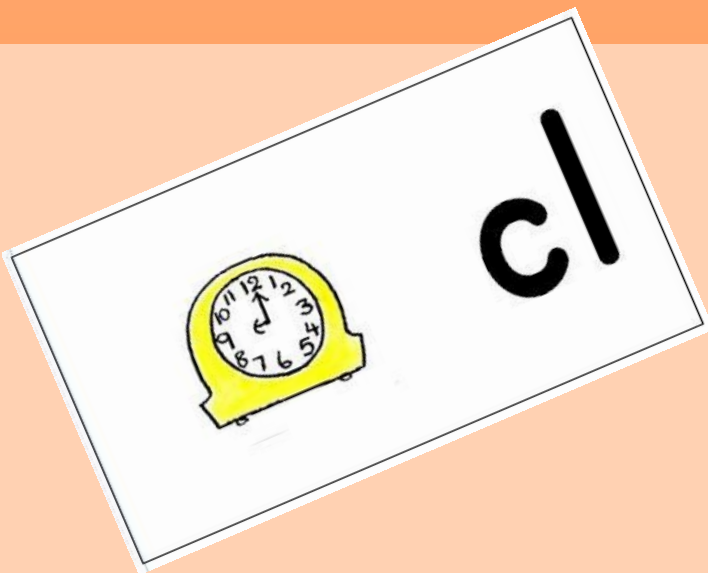

## 'ck' Game

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# 'ck' First Letter and Picture Game

'ck' always gives the hard 'k' sound after a short vowel. So 'ack', 'eck', 'ick', 'ock' and 'uck' must become familiar to your pupil. This game will help to that end.

## To make

Simply print out pages 4 to 8.

Cut up the yes/no cards.

Cut out the picture and endings cards.

## To play

Place the yes/no cards either in a feely bag, or face down, shuffled up in a box.

Sort the endings cards according to their vowel and stack them in five neat piles.

Deal three picture cards to each player and place the rest in another neat pile.

Each player in turn should take a yes/no card and if s/he gets a 'yes' s/he may try and match an ending card to a picture card. Give help as required, and sound out everything, even mistakes.

The winner is the one with the most completed words when there are no more endings left, although winning is not the aim of the game.

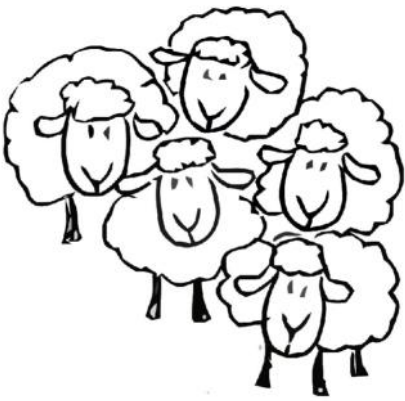

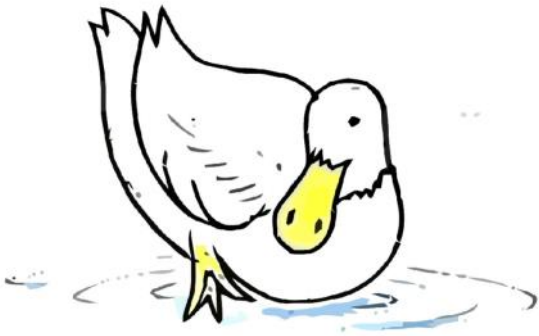

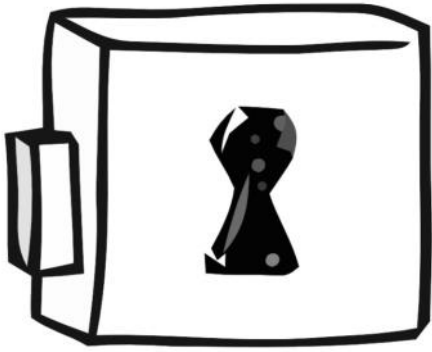

# 'ck' Read and Match Game

## How to make:

Print all game pages. Decide whether to use words or pictures as baseboards and cut up the other.

## How to play:

This game can either be played singly by one player as a matching activity, or played as a game with two players.

To play as a game, simply scatter the cut up pictures/sentences on the table. Take it in turns to choose a picture/sentence. If you have the matching picture/sentence place the card appropriately on your board. If not replace the card to the pool.

Play continues until all the cards have gone. The winner is the player who completed his/her board first.
